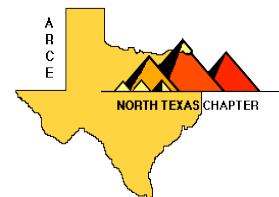
For many years Dr. Barta has explored the Old Kingdom area of
